## Emotional Functioning and Age: Some Surprising Changes

Robert W. Levenson is a Professor in the Department of Psychology at UC Berkeley where he also serves as Director of the Institute for Personality and Social Research, Director of the Clinical Science Program, and Director of the Berkeley Psychophysiology Laboratory. His research program is in the area of human emotion, studying the organization of physiological, behavioral and subjective systems; the ways that these systems are impacted by neuropathology, normal aging, and culture; and the role that emotions play in the maintenance and disruption of committed relationships. Levenson's research on intimate relationships includes a 20-year longitudinal study of long-term marriages that has focused on how spouses' emotional behavior changes over time.
